Pavlina R. Tcherneva is assistant professor of economics at Bard College. She has previously taught at Franklin and Marshall College and the University of Missouri-Kansas City. During 2000-2006, Pavlina served as the associate director for economic analysis at the Center for Full Employment and Price Stability, where she remains a research associate. In Summer 2006, she was a visiting scholar at the University of Cambridge Centre for Economic and Public Policy, U.K., and since July 2007, she has been a research scholar at the Levy Economics Institute.

Pavlina conducts research in the fields of public policy and monetary theory and has collaborated with policymakers from Argentina, Bulgaria, China, Turkey, and the United States on developing and evaluating various job creation programs. Her articles have appeared in the *Review of Social Economy*, *Journal of Post Keynesian Economics*, *International Journal of Political Economy*, *Rutgers Journal of Law and Urban Policy*, and other journals. She is the coeditor of *Full Employment and Price Stability: The Macroeconomic Vision of William S. Vickrey* (Elgar 2004).
